FR RAYMOND CHIBUZOR UGWU.

My name is Fr Raymond Chibuzor UGWU. The first out of the seven children of late Mr Raymond Ugwu and Mrs. Cordelia Ugwu. I am from Enugu state in Nigeria. My desire to become a priest started at age seven, and this motivated me to join the altar servers when I was in primary five just immediately after my First Holy Communion. In my primary six I took the entrance exam to the junior seminary high school of the Holy Ghost fathers and brothers. My parents supported me and sponsored me. I was ordained a Catholic priest in the order of the Holy Ghost fathers and brothers on July 10th 2004 at Holy Ghost Cathedral in Enugu, Nigeria by Bishop Anthony Gbuji.

MISSION WORK IN THE PHILIPPINES

Two months after my ordination I went to Philippines for mission experience. I was assigned to be a college school chaplain, campus minister, and a lecturer. From campus ministry, I went to a remote one-town parish made up of 31,000 people, 31 chapels and 33 village communities called "barangays". Almost half of the population was made up of the tribal people called the Subaneans. Work in this place was fun, all-inclusive, productive, and fulfilling. It focused mainly on the administration of the sacraments, basic faith formation, development of church leaders, environmental protection, proper parish and financial management, and structural improvement of the parish physical structures. Without expecting it, I spent seven years in this parish and from there I was sent back to campus ministry for one year and half at Cebu Doctors University, Cebu, Philippines.

COMING TO AUSTRALIA

After twelve years of mission experience in the Philippines, I got an invitation from Bishop Christopher A. Saunders, in 2016 to spend my long service leave in the diocese of Broome for three years among the Aborigines. It was an enjoyable period which gave me a firsthand experience among the first inhabitants of this great nation. The focus was more on the administration of the sacraments, teaching of the basic Catholic prayers and doctrines, and "mission of presence" (that is, full community visibility and active participation in the life of the community). My time in Broome was extended for another one year, but the COVID-19 lockdowns in Australia and the Philippines stretched my stay in Broome Diocese to six years by the end of which I got the Australian citizenship Privilege. This encouraged me to feel the need of staying on in the country I now call home, and to desire to join a diocese here, and so contribute meaningfully to the personnel need of the Australian church.

CHOOSING PARRAMATTA DIOCESE AND MY EXPECTATIONS

The multicultural nature of Parramatta diocese and the fact that it is in the eastern part of Australia made me to choose this diocese when I was considering the diocese to join. Thanks to the openness and welcoming attitude of our chief shepherd - Bishop Vincent Long and his consultors who accepted me for this probation period. It was in their kind consideration that I was sent to serve the people of God at St. Patricks Cathedral for ten weeks, O.L.Q.P. Greystanes Parish for nine months, and now St. Bernadette Parish, Castle Hill.

In conclusion, I expect that I can be of great service to the Diocese of Parramatta in general and to this Parish, while I am here. It is my wish that my presence will be: a valuable support to the pastoral care programmes, priests and the people of God here, bring right spiritual counsel to those in need of mercy and compassion; deliver and enhance right instructions on the good news; bring Jesus's healing to the sick; reconcile penitents with God; promote meaningful worship and mission work of Christ; initiate and lead the people of God in prayer; and so uphold the sacred Catholic rites and practises in a way that will edify God, and sanctify the people of God. Lastly, I hope to enjoy your care and welcoming hospitality as we live, work, and journey together as citizens of heaven and children of God the Father.



Gospel Matthew 22:1-14

Jesus said to the chief priests and elders of the people: 'The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a feast for his son's wedding. He sent his servants to call those who had been invited, but they would not come. Next he sent some more servants. "Tell those who have been invited" he said "that I have my banquet all prepared, my oxen and fattened cattle have been slaughtered, everything is ready. Come to the wedding." But they were not interested: one went off to his farm, another to his business, and the rest seized his servants, maltreated them and killed them. The king was furious. He dispatched his troops, destroyed those murderers and burnt their town. Then he said to his servants, "The wedding is ready; but as those who were invited proved to be unworthy, go to the crossroads in the town and invite everyone you can find to the wedding." So these servants went out onto the roads and collected together everyone they could find, bad and good alike; and the wedding hall was filled with guests. When the king came in to look at the guests he noticed one man who was not wearing a wedding garment, and said to him, "How did you get in here, my friend, without a wedding garment?" And the man was silent. Then the king said to the attendants, "Bind him hand and foot and throw him out into the dark, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth." For many are called, but few are chosen.'
