Before I left for our World Youth Day pilgrimage the joke at work was I'd come back with a husband or to join a convent. While I can confirm that neither has happened what I did come back with was something I didn't expect. I've come back with life long friends and a fire in my heart.

I had a slightly different experience to the rest of the St Bernadette's pilgrims making the decision to be in the same small group as a friend from another parish I found myself in a bus group without my St Bernadette's family where I only knew the names of 7 of the 44 people. 4 days in, I knew all their names and we became a family. And I still made sure to connect in with the St Bernadette's group.

Throughout the whole pilgrimage we shared the highs and the lows. We relied on each other, trusted each other and these friendships are now forged for a lifetime.

One thing no one tells you about pilgrimage is how much you and those around you cry. Don't worry, it's a good cry. When we got to Lourdes I started crying at the train station, overwhelmed to be at a place I had dreamed of since I was a child learning about Saint Bernadette in primary school. It was just totally overwhelming in the most spiritual way. I bonded with my fellow pilgrims through tears, smiles and hugs. Especially in Lourdes where at dinner I had a moment with someone which I'll remember for the rest of my life.





People also don't tell you half the fun of a world youth day pilgrimage is just being around other people who are also trying to grow in faith. The conversations between stops were deep and meaningful and enriching but could also be light hearted and funny giving each other ridiculous nicknames and bickering over which NRL team is superior (south's is the only correct answer).

These friendships and the experiences of the pilgrimage have set my heart alight. We have so many beautiful young people in the parish who I now want to walk with on their faith journeys. I think I've discounted the impact that being in a catholic community has had on my development as a person and I've come back with a greater drive than ever to want to foster a real connection and community within our parish. I hope the one thing that comes from WYD is our youth ministry at St Bernadette's growth stronger with more enthusiasm. If anyone wants to be part of this, in any capacity, please let any of us who are involved in the youth know. Most of all we ask just for your prayers.



I thank you all for your prayers for us while we were on World Youth Day and hope to make you all proud with the way we move into the future as young parishioners of St Bernadette's.

# **Today's Readings**

#### **Entrance Antiphon:**

To you I call; for you will surely heed me, O God; turn your ear to me; hear my words. Guard me as the apple of your eye; in the shadow of your wings protect me.

#### First Reading Isaiah 45:1.4-6

Thus says the Lord to his anointed, to Cyrus, whom he has taken by his right hand to subdue nations before him and strip the loins of kings, to force gateways before him that their gates be closed no more: It is for the sake of my servant Jacob, of Israel my chosen one, that I have called you by your name, conferring a title though you do not know me.
