#### Continued from last week

From Lourdes we continued on our pilgrimage into Spain, where we stopped in Loyola at the birthplace of Saint Ignatius. The Sanctuary of Loyola. In the grounds of this beautiful Jesuit site, we took some time to reflect as a group on our journey so far, and how we could continue to accompany and support one another on this pilgrimage. We then celebrated mass together in the Sanctuary of Loyola. From the outside the Basilica is an impressive but simple



looking baroque stone church, built alongside the family home of St Ignatius. Upon walking inside, the beautiful dome inside was captivating, and the acoustics very impressive. As the diocese joined in worship together, our words resonated throughout the spectacular church. After mass ended, we sat inside the church for another half hour, singing praises to God in this moving space.

We then spent the next few days in Avila, the birthplace of St Teresa. This beautiful walled city in Spain, filled with the rich history of St Teresa of Avila and St John of the Cross, gave us an opportunity to pray in the many beautiful churches within the city. Here we began to encounter more pilgrim groups from around the world as well, and celebrated mass together with two other Australian pilgrim groups.

From Avila we travelled to Portugal, stopping overnight in Fatima. We participated in the candlelit procession, and lit candles for the petitions of our parishioners. The Apparition of Our Lady in Fatima,



and the lives of Sister Lucia, and saints Francisco and Jacinta is much more recent, the apparitions occurring in 1917. As such, the site of Fatima is much more modern, with modern architecture, with infrastructure designed for pilgrimages. Millions of pilgrims travel here every year. Many pilgrims in Fatima were on their way to Lisbon for World Youth Day.

Over the week in Lisbon we participated in many events around the city, meeting young Catholics from all around the world, with different cultures, practices and in different stages of their faith journeys. It was so encouraging to be surrounded by so many like-minded Catholics, to be reminded that we are not alone in our faith, but supported by millions of other young Catholics around the world.

Personally, the Way of the Cross was a particularly moving event, watching the dancers portray the Stations of the Cross in a modern re-enactment was very powerful. Especially because one of the 22 young dancers was not just the only Australian chosen, but was the daughter of one of our fellow pilgrims from St John XXIII Parish in Stanhope. I was particularly moved by the Thirteenth Station, where the dancers portrayed Mary being given the shroud covering Jesus, and being overcome with sorrow. As they continues to dance, they folded the shroud until it became a bundle of joy, the baby Jesus wrapped up. The joy of a mother and her newborn son, with great hope for his future. Mary celebrating the life of her beloved son, Jesus.

On our walk to the final mass, it was encouraging to see the sense of community in the people around us. That even though we spoke different languages, people were tired and hot and being pushed in different directions in the massive crowds, people were still cheerful and encouraging to each other, sharing gifts and offering prayers. Once we found our spot to camp for the night, surrounded by thousands of other pilgrims in our little section, we struck up conversations with those sleeping nearby. We shared our space with a few other Australian groups, as well as a large number of Spanish, Italian and French pilgrims, and many smaller groups from all over the world.

Post World Youth Day week we went on retreat to Assisi, to reflect on the incredible pilgrimage we had been a part of, the experiences we had in Lisbon, and to learn more about St Francis of Assisi and Blessed Carlos Acutis. Many pilgrims shared their encounters on the journey, and we began making plans of how to encourage each other on our return, and how we can bring back our experiences to our local parishes and communities. The St Bernadette's Pilgrims are very excited to continue sharing our experiences with you all, and look forward to the growing opportunities in our parish. Several pilgrims have taken on more responsibilities in various ministries within the parish. We look forward to inspiring other youth in our Parish, and sharing God's love with everyone.

#### YOUNG ADULTS –SATURDAY 7TH OCTOBER





## **Today's Readings**

#### Entrance Antiphon:

Within your will, O Lord, all things are established, and there is none that can resist your will. For you have made all things, the heaven and the earth, and all that is held within the circle of heaven; you are the Lord of all.

#### First Reading Isaiah 5:1-7

Let me sing to my friend the song of his love for his vineyard. My friend had a vineyard on a fertile hillside. He dug the soil, cleared it of stones, and planted choice vines in it. In the middle he built a tower, he dug a press there too. He expected it to yield grapes, but sour grapes were all that it gave. And now, inhabitants of Jerusalem and men of Judah, I ask you to judge between my vineyard and me. What could I have done for my vineyard that I have not done? I expected it to yield grapes. Why did it yield sour grapes instead? Very well, I will tell you what I am going to do to my vineyard: I will take away its hedge for it to be grazed on, and knock down its wall for it to be trampled on. I will lay it waste, unpruned, undug; overgrown by the briar and the thorn. I will command the clouds to rain no rain on it. Yes, the vineyard of the Lord of hosts is the House of Israel, and the men of Judah that chosen plant. He expected justice, but found bloodshed, integrity, but only a cry of distress.

#### Second Reading Philippians 4:6-9

There is no need to worry; but if there is anything you need, pray for it, asking God for it with prayer and thanksgiving, and that peace of God, which is so much greater than we can understand, will guard your hearts and your thoughts, in Christ Jesus. Finally, brothers, fill your minds with everything that is true, everything that is noble, everything that is good and pure, everything that we love and honour, and everything that can be thought virtuous or worthy of praise. Keep doing all the things that you learnt from me and have been taught by me and have heard or seen that I do. Then the God of peace will be with you.

#### Gospel Matthew 21:33-43

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people, 'Listen to another parable. There was a man, a landowner, who planted a vineyard; he fenced it round, dug a winepress in it and built a tower; then he leased it to tenants and went abroad. When vintage time drew near he sent his servants to the tenants to collect his produce. But the tenants seized his servants, thrashed one, killed another and stoned a third. Next he sent some more servants, this time a larger number, and they dealt with them in the same way. Finally he sent his son to them. "They will respect my son," he said. But when the tenants saw the son, they said to each other, "This is the heir. Come on, let us kill him and take over his inheritance." So they seized him and threw him out of the vineyard and killed him. Now when the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those tenants? They answered, 'He will bring those wretches to a wretched end and lease the vineyard to other tenants who will deliver the produce to him when the season arrives.' Jesus said to them, 'Have you never read in the scriptures: It was the stone rejected by the builders that became the keystone. This was the Lord's doing and it is wonderful to see? 'I tell you, then, that the kingdom of God will be taken from you and given to a people who will produce its fruit.'
