23-24 MARCH 2024 PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD YEAR B

Hello everyone:

With the help of God, we reach the end of our Lenten journey, we stand today at the beginning of Holy Week. The most important week in the Christian calendar. At the beginning of this journey of Lent, Pope Francis invited us to reflect on Lent as a time where we discover God as the Lord who is the Lord who will set us free. As you know, his message for Lent this year was inspired by the biblical text from the book of Exodus; "I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery" (Ex 20:2)

Later in his document, the Pope invited us to reflect that Lent was also the time to make decisions capable of transforming the lives of others. As we enter the mystery of Holy Week, we are now invited to contemplate and reflect in the way God himself will offer us that freedom through the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of his beloved Son. In this contemplation we are also invited to reflect in the way that freedom has reached each of us.

It is my invitation that, as we approach this most sacred time, we make an effort to participate actively and devoutly in the liturgies that the Church celebrates in commemoration of this mystery. A mystery that is presented in different ways and at different levels through each of the important celebrations during Holy Week.

In addition to the Liturgies that the Parish will have, there are a couple of Liturgies you can also participate. These liturgies are held at the Cathedral, the mother church of our Diocese. One is the Celebration of the liturgy of Tenebrae, the word comes from the Latin and means "darkness" or "shadow" and it is an ancient religious service celebrated in the Church in the days before the Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Vigil) and it is characterised by the gradual extinction of candles while psalms are sung. This year, the Liturgy of the Tenebrae will be on the 25th of March at 7:30 pm at St Patrick's Cathedral in Parramatta.

The other liturgy Christians are invited to attend, and which also is held at the Cathedral, is the Chrism Mass, the Mass where the Bishop of the Diocese consecrates the Holy Chrism and blesses the Holy Oils used for the Sacraments. During the same liturgy, priests from the Diocese will renew they priestly promises in a powerful display of unity to the Bishop and with the support of the faithful present who are also invited to continue to offer prayers for the priests. At the end of the Eucharist, Priests, and representatives from each parish, are entrusted with the Holy Chrism and the Oils. The Chrism Mass will be at St Patrick's Cathedral on March 27th at 7:30 pm.

Finally, I would like to remind you that the Parish is doing a collection for the Food Bank for the House of Welcome, a ministry dedicated to support asylum seekers and migrants. The collection of non-perishable food is done during the Liturgy on Holy Thursday, we do it as a reminder of command given by Jesus on that Holy night of the Last Supper, to love one another. We want to do it as a sign of charity and love for those in need. Please support the initiative and offer whatever you can on that night. The collection will be done during the time of the Offering of the Gifts.

The Pastoral Team of the Parish is looking forward to walking with you during these holy days, we entrust ourselves into your prayers for the guidance and inspiration of the Holy Spirit so we can reflect together on these mysteries that give meaning to our faith. **Peace in Jesus**



Today's Readings

Entrance Gospel Mark 11:1-10

When they drew near to Jerusalem, to Bethphage and Bethany, at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples, and said to them, 'Go into the village opposite you, and immediately as you enter it you will find a colt tied, on which no one has ever sat; untie it and bring it. If anyone says to you, "Why are you doing this?" say, "The Lord has need of it and will send it back here immediately". And they went away, and found a colt tied at the door out in the open street; and they untied it. And those who stood there said to them, 'What are you doing, untying the colt?' And they told them what Jesus had said; and they let them go. And they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their garments on it: and he sat upon it. And many spread their garments on the road, and others spread leafy branches which they had cut from the fields. And those who went before and those who followed cried out, 'Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the kingdom of our father David that is coming! Hosanna in the highest!'

Entrance Antiphon:

First Reading Isaiah 50:4-7

The Lord has given me a disciple's tongue. So that I may know how to reply to the wearied he provides me with speech. Each morning he wakes me to hear, to listen like a disciple. The Lord has opened my ear. For my part, I made no resistance, neither did I turn away. I offered my back to those who struck me, my cheeks to those who tore at my beard; I did not cover my face against insult and spittle. The Lord comes to my help, so that I am untouched by the insults. So, too, I set my face like flint; I know I shall not be shamed.
