11-12 JAN 2025 THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD YEAR C

Hello Everyone!

With the help of God, we have finished the holy season of Advent and the joyful time of Christmas. Now the church is moving towards the celebration of what we know as Ordinary Time. As I have explained to you before, we call this time Ordinary because we name the Sundays of this time by the "ordinal numbers", which indicate the position of something in a list or sequence, first, second, third and so on. It is a mistake to think that "Ordinary Time" refers to a time when nothing happens it is just "ordinary".

To begin this Ordinary Time, the church gives us the opportunity to celebrate and contemplate the Baptism of the Lord. I thought it would be a good idea to learn together something about the Icon of the Baptism of the Lord as it has been handed down to us through the tradition of the East.

This icon is prominent in the feast of the Theophany of the Lord, sometimes called Epiphany. What we celebrated last week in the West as the Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord when the Three Wise Men come to offer gifts, in the East is called the Feast of the Theophany of the Lord, sometimes called Epiphany as well, but celebrates the Baptism of Jesus in the River Jordan.

The word Theophany means "Revelation of God;" Theophany therefore marks the revelation of the Trinitarian nature of God when Jesus was baptized. Those who witnessed heard the Father's voice from Heaven, saw the Spirit descending upon Jesus, and could see Jesus in the flesh, whom God confirmed to be His Son with His voice.

The symbolism of the Icon is quite deep and rich in details, although you can find different versions of the same icon, they all keep the same details due to the importance for the whole contemplation of the mystery of the Baptism of the Lord.



At the central part of the Icon is the image of Jesus, in many icons depicted with little or no clothing. This is important because all throughout the creation narrative in Genesis we see God creating and then saying it is "good." Man and woman were created together in God's image. They were both beautiful, and while they lacked physical garments, they were clothed in the glory of the "image" and "likeness" of God. However, when they fell into sin, they hid in shame until God brought them garments of skin to wear (which symbolizes the sinful tendency that now obscures our true nature). Their natural beauty was transformed into an object of shame. Adam and Eve fell, and with them fell creation.

Now, at the moment of his Baptism Jesus represents the second Adam (1 Cor 15). In shame and nakedness, Adam hid. Yet Christ comes in his majesty, both as God and man, both in glory and nakedness completely unashamed, representing the beauty of the undefiled human made possible through Him and in the subsequent centuries, Christians were often baptized without any clothing, shedding the garments of the "old man" to die in Christ and be resurrected in Him.



Today's Readings

Entrance Antiphon:

After the Lord was baptized, the heavens were opened, and the Spirit descended upon him like a dove, and the voice of the Father thundered: This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.

First Reading Isaiah 40:1-5. 9-11

'Console my people, console them' says your God. 'Speak to the heart of Jerusalem and call to her that her time of service is ended, that her sin is atoned for, that she has received from the hand of the Lord double punishment for all her crimes.' A voice cries, Prepare in the wilderness way for the Lord. Make a straight highway for our God across the desert. Let every valley be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, let every cliff become a plain, and the ridges a valley; then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed and all mankind shall see it; for the mouth of the Lord has spoken.' He is like a shepherd feeding his flock, gathering lambs in his arms, holding them against his breast and leading to their rest the mother ewes.

He sacrificed himself for us in order to set us free from all wickedness and to purify a people so that it could be his very own and would have no ambition except to do good. When the kindness and love of God our saviour for mankind were revealed, it was not because he was concerned with any righteous actions we might have done ourselves; it was for no reason except his own compassion that he saved us, by means of the cleansing water of rebirth and by renewing us with the Holy Spirit which he has so generously poured over us through Jesus Christ our saviour. He did this so that we should be justified by his grace, to become heirs looking forward to inheriting eternal life.

Now when all the people had been baptised and while Jesus after his own baptism was at prayer, heaven opened and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily shape, like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on you.'
