#### 2-3 August 2025 EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR C

As you may know, I have just returned from my pilgrimage of thanksgiving for the gift of the priesthood. Part of my trip included time in Rome where I was amazed by the rich history and culture of the Church. Thousands of canonized saints find their resting place in Rome, distinctly St. Peter at the Basilica in the Vatican City. As we enter the month of August, I am particularly excited about the celebration of our one and only St. Mary of the Cross Mackillop. Through multiple time zones and thousands of kilometres from Rome, we honour our own Australian Saint. Her life and example provide us hope for our country and belief that we too are called to be a saint.

St. Mary MacKillop, born on January 15, 1842, in Melbourne, Australia, remains a towering figure in the history of the Australian Church and is regarded as the first Australian to be canonized as a saint. Her journey from humble beginnings to sainthood is a testament to her deep faith, resilience, and unwavering commitment to the poor and marginalized.

Mary Helen MacKillop was the eldest of eight children in a poor Scottish immigrant family. Her father, Alexander MacKillop, struggled to provide for the family, and in 1851, he abandoned them, leaving Mary to help support her mother and siblings. Despite the challenges of poverty, Mary was a bright, compassionate child who was determined to become a teacher. Her passion for education led her to work as a governess and later, to open a small school for the children of working-class families in Penola, South Australia.

In 1866, Mary MacKillop's life took a pivotal turn when she met Father Julian Tenison Woods, a Jesuit priest with whom she shared a vision for the education of poor children. Together, they founded the Sisters of St. Joseph of the Sacred Heart, a religious congregation dedicated to providing education and support to the neglected and impoverished children across Australia, especially in rural and remote areas. The order was unique in that its members lived and worked outside of traditional convents, often teaching in remote communities and making education accessible to the most underserved populations.

The Sisters of St. Joseph expanded rapidly, and Mary became known as "Mother Mary," leading the order with an emphasis on simplicity, humility, and service. She worked tirelessly to establish schools, orphanages, and other institutions that would cater to the poor and abandoned. Mary also promoted the empowerment of women, encouraging them to be actively involved in their communities and to have a strong sense of social justice.

Throughout her life, St. Mary MacKillop faced numerous challenges, including financial difficulties, illness, and opposition from clergy and church authorities. Yet, her profound faith, determination, and commitment to serving others never wavered. She saw the face of God in every person, especially the most vulnerable, and dedicated her life to bringing the love of Christ to those in need.

Her most famous quote is "Never see a need without doing something about it". It is a call to action and to share the love of God wherever we go. It is a warning to indifference and apathy.

Mary MacKillop died on August 8, 1909, in North Sydney at the age of 67. Her influence on the Australian Church remains profound. The Sisters of St. Joseph continue to thrive, with schools, hospitals, and social programs dedicated to her mission. Her canonization by Pope Benedict XVI on October 17, 2010, was a recognition of her exceptional life of faith and service.

Her legacy endures, and her life serves as a model of courage, compassion, and commitment to justice, deeply influencing the Australian Church and inspiring generations of Catholics around the world. We celebrate her Feast day on August 8. The Church in Australia raises this celebration to the level of a Solemnity, highlighting her importance in the life of Catholics in Australia.

The remains of St. Mary Mackillop rest in the Memorial chapel in North Sydney. If you haven't visited there yet, I encourage you to make a pilgrimage of it as soon as you can. It is a great grace for us to be able to kneel before the grave of a Canonized Saint. A humble reminder that saints are ordinary people who loved God extraordinarily. There is also a museum on the grounds to help you enter into the story of her life.

# **Today's Readings**

### **Entrance Antiphon**

O God, come to my assistance; O Lord, make haste to help me! You are my rescuer, my help; O Lord, do not delay.

#### First Reading Ecclesiastes 1:2; 2:21-23

Vanity of vanities, the Preacher says. Vanity of vanities. All is vanity! For so it is that a man who has laboured wisely, skilfully and successfully must leave what is his own to someone who has not toiled for it at all. This, too, is vanity and great injustice; for what does he gain for all the toil and strain that he has undergone under the sun? What of all his laborious days, his cares of office, his restless nights? This, too, is vanity.

## Responsorial Psalm Ps 89:3-6. 12-14. 17. R. v.1 In every age, O Lord, you have been our refuge.

### Second Reading Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11

Since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is, sitting at God's right hand. Let your thoughts be on heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth, because you have died, and now the life you have is hidden with Christ in God. But when Christ is revealed – and he is your life – you too will be revealed in all your glory with him. That is why you must kill everything in you that belongs only to earthly life: fornication, impurity, guilty passion, evil desires and especially greed, which is the same thing as worshipping a false god; and never tell each other lies. You have stripped off your old behaviour with your old self, and you have put on a new self which will progress towards true knowledge the more it is renewed in the image of its creator; and in that image there is no room for distinction between Greek and Jew, between the circumcised or the uncircumcised, or between barbarian and Scythian, slave and free man. There is only Christ: he is everything and he is in everything.

A man in the crowd said to Jesus, 'Master, tell my brother to give me a share of our inheritance.' 'My friend,' he replied, 'who appointed me your judge, or the arbitrator of your claims?' Then he said to them, 'Watch, and be on your guard against avarice of any kind, for a man's life is not made secure by what he owns, even when he has more than he needs.' Then he told them a parable: 'There was once a rich man who, having had a good harvest from his land, thought to himself, "What am I to do? I have not enough room to store my crops." Then he said, "This is what I will do; I will pull down my barns and build bigger ones, and store all my grain and my goods in them, and I will say to my soul: My soul, you have plenty of good things laid by for many years to come; take things easy, eat, drink, have a good time." But God said to him, "Fool! This very night the demand will be made for your soul; and this hoard of yours, whose will it be then?" So it is when a man stores up treasure for himself in place of making himself rich in the sight of God.'
