Stewards of God's creation


For some reason, I have always found satisfaction in pulling out weeds. One time at the seminary I was heavy at work in the garden and a seminarian pulls into the parking lot. Thinking I might guilt trip him into joining me in the garden, he said to me with a pat on the back, 'Well done Menard. Gods first commandment to till the land yeah yeah', and he left. His departure left me annoyed and disappointed, but his words stirred interest and intrigue in my mind.

In Genesis 2:15, 'The Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it'. Adam was entrusted the cultivation of the land and to care for what God had created. I took great comfort and fulfilment, knowing that gardening is so rooted in our humanity.

Laudato Si', Pope Francis' 2015 encyclical, is a powerful call to care for our common home. Rooted in Catholic social teaching, it emphasises the interconnectedness of all creation and critiques the environmental degradation caused by human activity. The Pope urges a "conversion" of hearts and lifestyles, inviting all people—not just Catholics—to reflect on how ecological damage impacts the poor, future generations, and the planet itself. Central to Laudato Si' is the concept of integral ecology, which recognizes that environmental, social, economic, and spiritual issues are deeply intertwined.

The Season of Creation, celebrated annually from September 1 to October 4, aligns perfectly in Australia with the beginning of Spring and closely with the message of Laudato Si'. It is a time of prayer, reflection, and action dedicated to protecting Earth and its resources, including each other. The season begins on the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation and ends on the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of ecology. During this period, Christians worldwide are invited to renew their relationship with God, with one another, and with the Earth.

By linking spiritual reflection with practical action, both Laudato Si' and the Season of Creation deepen our awareness of the sacredness of creation and our responsibility to protect it. In a time of climate crisis, they offer a hopeful and urgent path forward rooted in faith, justice, and ecological responsibility.



As we enter the Spring season, let us take particular notice of the beauty of God's creation. As plants grow, flowers bloom AND THE SUN COMES OUT, let us take the opportunity to express our gratitude to the Lord for his providence. Creation is here to provide us with food, shelter and clothing, but also for our enjoyment, companionship and productivity. Let us enter the season of creation with a focus on our stewardship of God's creation.

# Second Reading Hebrews 12:18-19, 22-24

You have come to God himself, the supreme Judge, and been placed with spirits of the saints who have been made perfect; and to Jesus, the mediator who brings a new covenant.

# Gospel Luke 14:1. 7-14

On a sabbath day Jesus had gone for a meal to the house of one of the leading Pharisees; and they watched him closely. He then told the guests a parable, because he had noticed how they picked the places of honour. He said this, 'When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not take your seat in the place of honour. A more distinguished person than you may have been invited, and the person who invited you both may come and say, "Give up your place to this man." And then, to your embarrassment, you would have to go and take the lowest place. No; when you are a guest, make your way to the lowest place and sit there, so that, when your host comes, he may say, "My friend, move up higher." In that way, everyone with you at the table will see you honoured. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the man who humbles himself will be exalted.' Then he said to his host, 'When you give a lunch or a dinner, do not ask your friends, brothers, relations or rich neighbours, for fear they repay your courtesy by inviting you in return. No; when you have a party, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; that they cannot pay you back means that you are fortunate, because repayment will be made to you when the virtuous rise again.'
