Newly Ordained, Newly Sent: Understanding the First Blessing of a New Catholic Priest

Over 19 years in formation for the priesthood, I acquired an invisible list of men I met before they entered the seminary, and became a priest before me. It has been quite the humbling experience which I often brought to the Lord in complaint and surrender. I can remember kneeling before them and asking their blessings as newly ordained priests.

Fast forward and my journey has brought me to graciously receive the gift of the sacrament of Holy Orders. It has been quite the ride and an adventure for the ages. As I reflect on the journey, my heart is filled with joy and gratitude that the Lord has chosen me to be his priest. In hindsight, I value each year of my formation as the Lord took time to chip away at the hardness of my heart.

I am deeply blessed to stand before this community each week, humbled to act in the person of Christ, as preside over our liturgy. While the priesthood is a gift given to me, it is a gift for the church, the people of God. The priesthood is a sign of God's prophecy to Jeremiah 'I will give you shepherds after my own heart' Jer 3:15.

10 months have passed since my ordination as a priest and I would like to remind the community about the graces that come with receiving the first blessings of a newly ordained priest in his first year. (After November 21, I'll start charging a fee haha!)


The First Blessing of a newly ordained Catholic priest is a significant and deeply spiritual tradition in the Church. It usually takes place immediately following the ordination Mass, often beginning with the new priest offering a blessing to the bishop who ordained him, followed by blessings to family, friends, and members of the faithful. It was such a special moment sharing that with the people who have loved me to perseverance. By the time I finished that evening with all the blessings, all the food was gone and all the visitors had left!

This moment is powerful because the priest, having just received the Sacrament of Holy Orders, is now acting 'in persona Christi' — in the person of Christ — in a unique and sacramental way. Through ordination, a man is configured to Christ the High Priest, and he receives the authority to bless, to consecrate the Eucharist, to forgive sins, and to shepherd the people of God. His first blessing is a visible sign of the spiritual transformation that has taken place in him through the sacrament.

This first blessing also represents a bond between the priest and the community that has nurtured his vocation. Many choose to give this blessing first to their parents or godparents, recognising their role in guiding the priest toward his calling. Tradition also holds that anyone who receives a new priest's first blessing may receive a 'plenary indulgence', under the usual conditions (Confession, Communion, detachment from sin, and prayer for the Pope's intentions).

The first blessing is not merely a personal gesture — it is the beginning of a life of service. It marks the start of the priest's public ministry, rooted in prayer, sacrifice, and love for the people of God.

Feel free after any mass to approach me and ask for my first priestly blessing. I would be honoured to share that with you. In return I humbly ask that you keep me in your prayers as I continue answering yes everyday to being a shepherd after the heart of the Lord. Let us also remember to pray for more vocations to the priesthood.

Today's Readings

Entrance Antiphon

I am the salvation of the people, says the Lord. Should they cry to me in any distress, I will hear them, and I will be their Lord for ever.

First Reading Amos 8:4-7

Listen to this, you who trample on the needy and try to suppress the poor people of the country, you who say, 'When will New Moon be over so that we can sell our corn, and sabbath, so that we can market our wheat? Then by lowering the bushel, raising the shekel, by swindling and tampering with the scales, we can buy up the poor for money, and the needy for a pair of sandals, and get a price even for the sweepings of the wheat.' The Lord swears it by the pride of Jacob, 'Never will I forget a single thing you have done.'

Responsorial Psalm Ps 112:1-2. 4-8. R. see vv.1. 7 Praise the Lord who lifts up the poor.

Second Reading 1 Timothy 2:1-8

My advice is that, first of all, there should be prayers offered for everyone – petitions, intercessions and thanksgiving – and especially for kings and others in authority, so that we may be able to live religious and reverent lives in peace and quiet. To do this is right, and will please God our saviour: he wants everyone to be saved and reach full knowledge of the truth. For there is only one God, and there is only one mediator between God and mankind, himself a man, Christ Jesus, who sacrificed himself as a ransom for them all. He is the evidence of this, sent at the appointed time, and I have been named a herald and apostle of it and – I am telling the truth and no lie – a teacher of the faith and the truth to the pagans. In every place, then, I want the men to lift their hands up reverently in prayer, with no anger or argument.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'There was a rich man and he had a steward who was denounced to him for being wasteful with his property. He called for the man and said, "What is this I hear about you? Draw me up an account of your stewardship because you are not to be my steward any longer." Then the steward said to himself, "Now that my master is taking the stewardship from me, what am I to do? Dig? I am not strong enough. Go begging? I should be too ashamed. Ah, I know what I will do to make sure that when I am dismissed from office there will be some to welcome me into their homes." 'Then he called his master's debtors one by one. To the first he said, "How much do you owe my master?" "One hundred measures of oil," was the reply. The steward said, "Here, take your bond; sit down straight away and write fifty." To another he said, "And you, sir, how much do you owe?" "One hundred measures of wheat." was the reply. The steward said. "Here, take your bond and write eighty." 'The master praised the dishonest steward for his astuteness. For the children of this world are more astute in dealing with their own kind than are the children of light. 'And so I tell you this: use money, tainted as it is, to win you friends, and thus make sure that when it fails you, they will welcome you into the tents of eternity. The man who can be trusted in little things can be trusted in great; the man who is dishonest in little things will be dishonest in great. If then you cannot be trusted with money, that tainted thing, who will trust you with genuine riches? And if you cannot be trusted with what is not yours, who will give you what is your very own? 'No servant can be the slave of two masters: he will either hate the first and love the second, or treat the first with respect and the second with scorn. You cannot be the slave both of God and of money.'
