Warrior, Messenger, and Healer: God's Heavenly Servants

Prior to my Confirmation in year 6, I never really had an encounter with learning about saints. I recall one time opening the bible for leisure to Revelation and the story of the Archangel Michael defeating the dragon, the ancient serpent. I was so inspired by his bravery and willingness to stand up for God. I chose Michael as my confirmation saint and have continued to have a great devotion to St. Michael.

On September 29 we celebrate the Solemnity of the Archangels. The archangels Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael are three of the most prominent angels in Judeo-Christian tradition, each with distinct roles and attributes that highlight their spiritual significance. Their role in Salvation History can be found in the bible.

Archangel Michael is often seen as the leader of the heavenly armies. His name means "Who is like God?", a rhetorical question emphasising God's unmatched power. In the Bible, Michael appears in the Book of Daniel as a protector of Israel and in the Book of Revelation as a warrior who defeats Satan in a great celestial battle. He is typically portrayed as a strong, armoured figure wielding a sword, symbolising justice and divine protection. In Christian tradition, Michael is considered a patron of soldiers and police officers and is often invoked in prayers for strength and deliverance from evil.

Archangel Gabriel is primarily known as a divine messenger. His name means "God is my strength." Gabriel appears in both the Old and New Testaments. In the Book of Daniel, he helps interpret visions, while in the Gospel of Luke, he famously announces to Mary that she will give birth to Jesus—one of the most pivotal moments in Christian theology. Gabriel is the 'Angel of the Lord who declared unto Mary'. Often depicted with a trumpet or scroll, Gabriel symbolises revelation, communication, and divine guidance.

Archangel Raphael is associated with healing and guidance. His name means "God heals." Raphael is featured in the Book of Tobit, where he disguises himself as a human to assist Tobit and his son Tobias. Raphael heals Tobit's blindness and protects Tobias on his journey, emphasising his role as a guardian and healer. He is often shown holding a staff and a fish, referencing the story's events. In Christian tradition, Raphael is the patron of travellers, doctors, and those seeking healing.

Together, Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael represent three central aspects of divine action in the world: protection, revelation, and healing. While their appearances in scripture vary, their roles have made a lasting impact on religious thought, art, and devotional practice. Their enduring presence reflects humanity's longing for divine help, wisdom, and healing in times of trouble.

On October 2 we also celebrate the memorial of the Guardian Angels. These heavenly protectors are assigned to guide and guard each soul. In God's love, they lead us away from sin and toward holiness. Let us thank God for their constant presence and ask for their help to remain faithful on our journey to Heaven.

This weekend, I invite you to consider which title and archangel resonates with you the most. Warrior, Messenger or Healer? It is obvious that God shows forth the importance of the Angels in our preserving and enhancing our relationship with him. Though invisible, it is important for Christians to be aware of the faithful presence of Angels who protect, guide and strengthen us each day. Have a blessed Solemnity of the Archangels!


KELLYVILLE PARISH MARIAN PROCESSION: 11 OCTOBER



Gospel Luke 16:19-31

Jesus said to the Pharisees: 'There was a rich man who used to dress in purple and fine linen and feast magnificently every day. Now the poor man died and was carried away by angels to the bosom of Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried. 'In his torment in Hades he looked up and saw Abraham a long way off with Lazarus in his bosom. So he cried out, "Father Abraham, pity me and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, for I am in agony in these flames." "My son," Abraham replied "remember that during your life good things come your way, just as bad things came the way of Lazarus. Now he is being comforted here while you are in agony. But that is not all: between us and you a great gulf has been fixed, to stop anyone, if he wanted to, crossing from our side to yours, and to stop any crossing from your side to ours." 'The rich man replied, "Father, I beg you then to send Lazarus to my father's house, since I have five brothers, to give them warning, so that they do not come to this place of torment too."
