An earthly father and a Heavenly Father

I can remember my youth, walking in the house and seeing my parents sitting on the couch with each other, sun on face, coffee in hands, not saying anything, gazing into the abyss as if they had not a worry in the world. For some reason, us children, would be drawn to the couch with them. I would often lay my head on my dads lap, smell his coffee breath and relax as he beat his feet to the Bee Gees in the background.

This was outside the time where my dad would work multiple jobs, drive us around to all our sports and extra-curricular activities, pick us up late from parties whenever we would call, let me see his belt when I needed some discipline and feed us with the only thing he knew how to cook, porridge. Of course, I only realised and appreciated this in my adulthood.

I believe my relationship with my dad has influenced how I relate with the Heavenly Father. My dad wasn't perfect, but his love and dedication has paved the way for me to encounter God's Fatherly love. I am humbled that the Father would call me his beloved son, despite my many sins, failures and weaknesses. I used to see the Heavenly Father as simply the judge who I needed to impress and not offend. Now I am grateful to have experienced his great fatherly love, mercy and generosity to me. I believe we get our faith wrong when we don't have a healthy relationship with the Heavenly Father.

Fathers play a vital and irreplaceable role in the structure and emotional health of a family. While traditional views have often cast fathers as mere breadwinners, the modern understanding of fatherhood recognises the depth of their influence on emotional, psychological, and social development. Their presence, Involvement, and guidance contribute significantly to a well-rounded and stable family environment. When a father is actively involved in his child's life, the child often feels more secure and confident navigating the world.

Fathers also serve as key role models, especially for sons, but also for daughters. For boys, a father's behaviour becomes a blueprint for manhood—how to handle challenges, show respect, express emotion, and treat others. For girls, a father's love and attention often influence how they view themselves and what they expect in future relationships. A father who is affectionate, respectful, and supportive helps children form healthy expectations and build high self-esteem.

Emotional development is deeply influenced by a father's involvement. Numerous studies show that children with involved fathers are less likely to suffer from depression, anxiety, or behavioural problems. They tend to perform better in school, form stronger friendships, and exhibit greater emotional resilience. This stems from a father's unique way of communicating and interacting, which often complements a mother's approach. Fathers tend to encourage risk-taking, independence, and problem-solving—skills that are essential for facing life's challenges.

Fathers also play a crucial role in teaching discipline and boundaries. Their approach often leans toward setting expectations and encouraging accountability, which helps children develop a sense of responsibility and respect for rules. While discipline from either parent is important, a father's consistent involvement often strengthens the impact of such lessons. The absence of a father figure can lead to a noticeable gap in a child's development. This doesn't mean single mothers can't raise successful children—many do—but it highlights the unique value a father can bring when he is present and engaged.

As we celebrate Father's day this weekend, let us keep our fathers in our thoughts, prayers, affirmations and gifts. Fathers are more than simply providers; they are protectors, teachers, mentors, and emotional anchors. Their presence contributes to the strength and success of a family unit. Encouraging active fatherhood—where fathers participate in nurturing, teaching, and guiding their children—creates a legacy of strong, confident, and well-adjusted individuals. A father's love and involvement are not just beneficial; they are essential for a thriving family life. May St. Joseph, chosen by the Father, intercede for all fathers in the world.

## **Today's Readings**

#### **Entrance Antiphon**

You are just, O Lord, and your judgement is right; treat your servant in accord with your merciful love.

#### First Reading Wisdom 9:13-18

What man can know the intentions of God? Who can divine the will of the Lord? The reasonings of mortals are unsure and our intentions unstable; for a perishable body presses down the soul, and this tent of clay weighs down the teeming mind. It is hard enough for us to work out what is on earth, laborious to know what lies within our reach; who, then, can discover what is in the heavens? As for your intention, who could have learnt it, had you not granted Wisdom and sent your holy spirit from above? Thus have the paths of those on earth been straightened and men been taught what pleases you, and saved, by Wisdom.

#### Responsorial Psalm Ps 89:3-6. 12-14. 17. R. v.1

In every age, O Lord, you have been our refuge.

#### Second Reading Philemon 9-10, 12-17

This is Paul writing, an old man now and, what is more, still a prisoner of Christ Jesus. I am appealing to you for a child of mine, whose father I became while wearing these chains: I mean Onesimus. I am sending him back to you, and with him – I could say – a part of my own self. I should have liked to keep him with me; he could have been a substitute for you, to help me while I am in the chains that the Good News has brought me. However, I did not want to do anything without your consent; it would have been forcing your act of kindness, which should be spontaneous. I know you have been deprived of Onesimus for a time, but it was only so that you could have him back for ever, not as a slave any more, but something much better than a slave, a dear brother; especially dear to me, but how much more to you, as a blood-brother as well as a brother in the Lord. So if all that we have in common means anything to you, welcome him as you would me.

Let your face shine on your servant, and teach me your laws.

#### **Gospel Luke 14:25-33**

Great crowds accompanied Jesus on his way and he turned and spoke to them. 'If any man comes to me without hating his father, mother, wife, children, brothers, sisters, yes and his own life too, he cannot be my disciple. Anyone who does not carry his cross and come after me cannot be my disciple. 'And indeed, which of you here, intending to build a tower, would not first sit down and work out the cost to see if he had enough to complete it? Otherwise, if he laid the foundation and then found himself unable to finish the work, the onlookers would all start making fun of him and saying, "Here is a man who started to build and was unable to finish." Or again, what king marching to war against another king would not first sit down and consider whether with ten thousand men he could stand up to the other who advanced against him with twenty thousand? If not, then while the other king was still a long way off, he would send envoys to sue for peace. So in the same way, none of you can be my disciple unless he gives up all his possessions.'
