Hello everyone.

We are fast approaching the feast of the Presentation of the Lord on the Second of February. Before the changes to the liturgical calendar approved and promoted by the Second Vatican Council, the second of February closes what it was known as the "Epiphany Time" and it also marks 40 days since we celebrate the Nativity of the Lord. In some countries, the feast of the Presentation of the Lord, is the day when the Christmas decorations come down, however in Australia and in many countries the Christmas celebrations ended with the feast of the Epiphany of the Lord on the 6th of January.

Devotion to the Child Jesus is popular not only in Mexico but also around the world. Just last week, many in the Filipino community celebrated the feast of the Santo Niño. This veneration to the Child Jesus is rooted in the belief that even as a child, Christ was ready to do the mission His Father sent Him to do. As an infant, He was both loved (by the Magi and the shepherds) and persecuted (by Herod the Great). He showed an example of obedience to religious authority by being presented in the temple.

Devotion to the Child Jesus is a way of honoring the virtues of Christ's childhood. The image of the Child Jesus is an invitation to strive for the virtues of simplicity, innocence, humility, obedience, and childlike trust and confidence in the Father. The veneration of the image is, therefore, more than an external expression of our natural love for Jesus but hopefully it also involves a commitment to strive after the Child Jesus' special virtues.

Each year, I have been dressing up our infant Jesus in different ways that show that even from his childhood, Jesus is the Lord that we worship as King, as the Good Shepherd, last year we venerated the Baby Doctor as I was praying for the health of my sister. He has also been dressed as the different devotions of the Child Jesus through history as the image of the Holy Infant of Atocha.

This year, I decided to dress Jesus as the Divine Mercy, as you know, the devotion to Divine Mercy, originated from the visions of St. Faustina Kowalska, canonized on April 30, 2000. This particular devotion emphasizes the mercy poured forth from Christ's Passion and Resurrection, the fount of the Holy Spirit who forgives sins and restores joy in redemption. Centered on the Second Sunday of Easter—now Divine Mercy Sunday—this devotion finds its "natural locus" in the Easter liturgy, where the paschal Christ embodies mercy as "his living sign, both historico-salvific and eschatological." The faithful are urged to integrate it with liturgical celebrations, singing "forever of the Lord's mercy" (Ps 89:2).



The Divine Mercy image with rays of blood and water and that is what the garment of Baby Jesus is wearing. St. John Paul II, who had a strong devotion to the Divine Mercy, consecrated the Shrine of Divine Mercy in Kraków-Łagiewniki on August 17, 2002, entrusting the world's destiny to merciful God as he said in the day of the consecration: "In the mercy of God the world will find peace and mankind will find happiness!"

We should always keep in mind that, what the devotion and tradition of dressing Baby Jesus under the different devotions to Jesus, it is a reminder that the Eternal Word of the Father became flesh in Jesus. That Jesus, even as a child is the Savior, the King, the Good Shepherd, the Healer from God and this year we want to reflect of the Divine Mercy of God as we contemplate Baby Jesus wearing the garments of this beautiful devotion. May you have a year full of blessings that come from the mercy of God.

Dear Jesus, for the sake of your sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world!

Today's Readings

Entrance Antiphon

O sing a new song to the Lord; sing to the Lord, all the earth.
In his presence are majesty and splendour, strength and honour in his holy place.

First Reading Isaiah 8:23 – 9:3

In days past the Lord humbled the land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali, but in days to come he will confer glory on the Way of the Sea on the far side of Jordan, province of the nations. The people that walked in darkness has seen a great light; on those who live in a land of deep shadow a light has shone. You have made their gladness greater, you have made their joy increase, they rejoice in your presence as men rejoice at harvest time, as men are happy when they are dividing the spoils. For the yoke that was weighing on him, the bar across his shoulders, the rod of his oppressor, these you break as on the day of Midian.

Responsorial Psalm Ps 26:1. 4. 13-14. R. v.1

The Lord is my light and my salvation.

Second Reading 1 Corinthians 1:10-13, 17

I appeal to you, brothers, for the sake of our Lord Jesus Christ, to make up the differences between you, and instead of disagreeing among yourselves, to be united again in your belief and practice. From what Chloe's people have been telling me, my dear brothers, it is clear that there are serious differences among you. What I mean are all these slogans that you have, like: 'I am for Paul', 'I am for Apollos', 'I am for Cephas', 'I am for Christ'. Has Christ been parcelled out? Was it Paul that was crucified for you? Were you baptised in the name of Paul? For Christ did not send me to baptise, but to preach the Good News, and not to preach that in the terms of philosophy in which the crucifixion of Christ cannot be expressed.

Gospel Matthew 4:12-23

Hearing that John had been arrested Jesus went back to Galilee, and leaving Nazareth he went and settled in Capernaum, a lakeside town on the borders of Zebulun and Naphtali. In this way the prophecy of Isaiah was to be fulfilled: Land of Zebulun! Land of Naphtali! Way of the sea on the far side of Jordan, Galilee of the nations! The people that lived in darkness has seen a great light; on those who dwell in the land and shadow of death a light has dawned. From that moment Jesus began his preaching with the message, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand.' As he was walking by the Sea of Galilee he saw two brothers, Simon, who was called Peter, and his brother Andrew; they were making a cast in the lake with their net, for they were fishermen. And he said to them, 'Follow me and I will make you fishers of men.' And they left their nets at once and followed him. Going on from there he saw another pair of brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John; they were in their boat with their father Zebedee, mending their nets, and he called them. At once, leaving the boat and their father, they followed him. He went round the whole of Galilee teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the Good News of the kingdom and curing all kinds of diseases and sickness among the people.
